



Questions about the CoVID-19 Vaccine

Q. Do we have the COVID Vaccine?

A. No, as of early January, we do not have supplies of COVID-19 vaccines at our facilities.

Q. Are we getting the COVID vaccine? If so, when?

A. While we expect to receive supplies of the vaccine in the coming months, we are dependent upon the NH Department of Health and Human Services to supply us with the vaccine. As we learn more, we will inform our patients.

Q. Can I get on a waitlist for the vaccine? or a referral?

A. CCFHS does not currently have a waitlist available for the COVID -19 vaccine. A referral is not necessary at this time, as the vaccine is currently being distributed by the State of NH.

Q. Is the CCFHS staff getting vaccinated?

A. Some of our health care staff providing testing and other direct care are currently scheduled to receive the vaccine as distributed by the State of NH.

Q. Is the vaccine safe for me with my health conditions?

Q. What will the vaccine cost?

A. The state has indicated that there will be no cost for the vaccine. However, some facilities may charge an administration or visit fee. This will likely be covered by insurance. It is best to check with your insurance carrier. If you do not have insurance, there will be no cost.
